Event Protocols pertaining to Covid-19

Based on current State and County mandates here is what to expect. Below is the current masking requirements for our "public event/venue" that does **not** meet the "mega event" classification. I have highlighted the section directly related to our event spectators and athletes.

Athletes will not be required to wear a face covering during performance of any skills or routines but will be required at **all other times**. Remember, we are relying on you to self-monitor. If you have had any close contact exposure within 10 days of the event (within 6 feet of a confirmed positive individual for 15 minutes within a 24-hour period) you should be self-quarantining and **not** attend. If you have any symptoms or are not feeling well - please stay home and take care of yourself.

Masking Requirements

Masks are **required for all individuals** in the following indoor settings, regardless of vaccination status:

- On public transit[1] (examples: airplanes, ships, ferries, trains, subways, buses, taxis, and ride-shares) and in transportation hubs (examples: airport, bus terminal, marina, train station, seaport or other port, subway station, or any other area that provides transportation)
- **Indoors** in K-12 schools[2], childcare[3]
- Emergency shelters[4] and cooling centers[5]

Masks are **required for all individuals**, in the following indoor settings, regardless of vaccination status (and surgical masks are recommended):

- Healthcare settings[6]
- State and local correctional facilities and detention centers[7]
- Homeless shelters[8]
- Long Term Care Settings[9] & Adult and Senior Care Facilities[10]

Additionally, masks are **required* for unvaccinated individuals** in indoor public settings and businesses (examples: retail, restaurants, theaters, family entertainment centers, meetings, state and local government offices serving the public).

See State Health Officer Order, issued on July 26, 2021, for a full list of high-risk congregate and other healthcare settings where surgical masks are required for unvaccinated workers, and recommendations for respirator use for unvaccinated workers in healthcare and long-term care facilities in situations or settings not covered by Cal OSHA ETS or ATD.

Exemptions to masks requirements

The following **individuals** are exempt from wearing masks at all times:

- Persons younger than two years old. Very young children must not wear a mask because of the risk of suffocation.
- Persons with a medical condition, mental health condition, or disability that prevents wearing a mask. This includes persons with a medical condition for whom wearing a mask could obstruct breathing or who are unconscious, incapacitated, or otherwise unable to remove a mask without assistance.
- Persons who are hearing impaired, or communicating with a person who is hearing impaired, where the ability to see the mouth is essential for communication.
