## Pest identification, monitoring and inspection

Pest Identification is done by: Hobbs Pest Solutions

Monitoring and inspecting for pests and conditions that lead to pest problems are done regularly by Preschool Director/Staff and results are communicated to the IPM Coordinator.
